Rotterdam Tour Itinerary

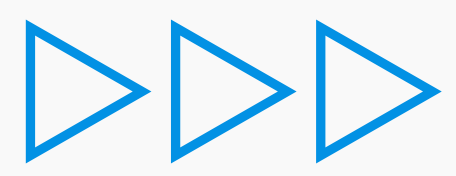
A guided walk through Rotterdam's city center. For years, the question remained: where Rotterdam's city center actually was, or what the city center even was. The historic city triangle? The post-war center around the Lijnbaan? A city without a heart, in other words! Meanwhile, Rotterdam has a very big heart.

In two hours, you can walk from the spectacularly renovated Rotterdam Central Station, past the high-rises of the Weena, and through the post-war architecture of the shopping area, into the historic city center with the Cube Houses

History isn't on the streets, but it is still tangible. Eclectic architectural styles, excavations, street names, and historical names provide numerous clues that Rotterdam is an old city, but with a modern twist. Just as the Market hall is a centuries-old concept in a modern building.

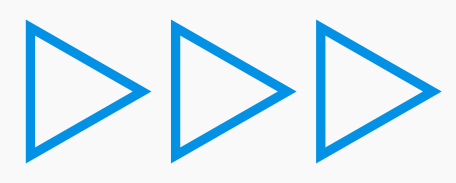

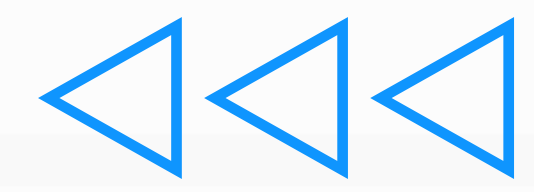

In-person or virtual presenters will have 13 minutes for paper presentation, and then 2 minutes for Q&A.

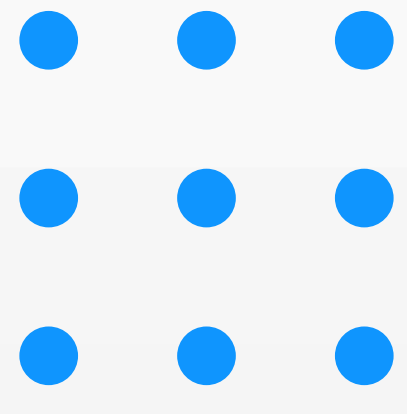
